Experience the history of leisure, from its historical origins to its value in modern society through excursions, service learning, and cultural immersion experiences. Learn how Ancient Greece gave rise to the concept of leisure, spectator sports, festivals, theater and tourism. See historical sites and modern architecture. Explore how the 2004 Olympic venue development changed the landscape of Greece. Examine how tourism affects community development and culture. Travel throughout Greece and the nearby isles and gain a comprehensive understanding of the Greek culture through involvement with the other organizations and agencies. This course will incorporate history, public policy, and leisure and recreation studies, as we learn how democracy changed the Greek culture and influenced the leisure of today.

**COST:** Estimated at \$3800, includes:

- Application charge (\$200)
- Tuition for 6 credits
- Accommodations in Athens and on overnight trips to Olympia, Delphi, Corinth, Paros, Nafpaktos, and Santorini
- Transportation for excursions
- Sightseeing and entrance fee costs
- Welcome & farewell receptions and some meals
- International accident/health insurance coverage
